Privacy Policy

Clearing Your Browser Cache and History

Your browser also records all the sites that you visit in its History folder. Glossary of Terms

Browser: A browser is software application that allows you to access to the worldwide web and enables you to view website pages. Microsoft Internet Explorer or Netscape Navigator are examples of browsers.

Cookies: A cookie is a message sent by a web browser to a web server. This is a mechanism for storing and retrieving information from previously visited websites. Cookies are designed to make access faster if you visit the same sites again.

History: This is a function that allows you to view the addresses of websites you have previously. The website addresses are organised into folders, which also contain the links to all the pages you visited within a site. The history function is especially useful if you want to return to a page, but can't remember the address because you didn't bookmark it (add it to your Favourites' folder).
